- Use your turn signal to indicate your intent to turn left




Flashing Yellow Arrow: Yield to oncoming traffic, then turn left when clear.



Green Arrow: Left turn is protected. You have the right of way.



- Yield the right of way before turning





- Turn only when your path is clear






